# TERMS & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

The following terms and conditions apply to all entries to the 'HART Prize for Human Rights'. By entering the competition, you agree to be bound by these terms and conditions.

1. The promoter of the 'HART Prize for Human Rights' is the Humanitarian Aid Relief Trust (HART) whose address is: Unit 1 Jubilee Business Centre, 213 Kingsbury Road, Kingsbury, London, NW9 8AQ.
2. The 'HART Prize for Human Rights' is a series of competitions open to anyone aged 11 - 25, anywhere in the world. However, HART is not in a position to cover travel costs for anyone willing to attend the event.
3. There are two categories: Essay and Creative. A single person can make a single entry in one or both categories. Both categories are divided into three age groups:  
Junior (year 7 - year 11)  
Intermediate (year 12 and year 13)  
Advanced (19 - 25)
4. To enter the Essay category of the Prize, you are required to write an essay on an issue related to human rights in the countries where HART works.
5. The word limit for the Junior and Intermediate groups is 800 and the word limit for the Advanced group is 1,200 words. They do not include footnotes and the bibliography.
6. These essays must be entirely your work. Senior essays must be properly referenced, in your own preferred referencing style.
7. To enter the Creative category of the Prize, you are required to produce a creative piece of work about the human rights or humanitarian situation in any of the countries in which HART works.

8. Accepted artistic mediums include poems, short stories, paintings, drawings, illustrations, collages, graphic design, infographics, photographs and videos. Other mediums may be accepted – if your preferred art form is not listed please get in touch.
9. All essay entries and digital creative pieces or photos of artwork are to be sent to [hart.competition@hart-uk.org](mailto:hart.competition@hart-uk.org). All other tangible creative pieces should be sent, at the entrant's own expense, to HART Prize for Human Rights, Unit 1 Jubilee Business Centre, 213 Kingsbury Road, Kingsbury, London, NW9 8AQ.
10. You are responsible for the costs incurred in the creation and submission of your entry.
11. We take no responsibility for entries that are lost, delayed, misdirected, incomplete, or not delivered or entered.
12. When submitting your entry, you are required to fill in the 'HART Prize for Human Rights Entry Form' found on the HART website.
13. Only individuals may be considered for awards in the HART Human Rights Prize. Any entry on behalf of others or of an organisation or institution will not be valid.
14. The closing date for entries is listed clearly on the website. Your entry must be received by 11:59 PM on that day. Any entry received after this date will not be accepted.
15. Your entry must:
  - a. Be your own work. You must have full copyright to your entry as its author;
  - b. Be fully referenced (Senior Essay category only);
  - c. If a creative piece, not feature any person without their consent;
  - d. Not be offensive, defamatory or inappropriate;
  - e. Respect all of the terms and conditions listed in this document.

# TERMS & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

16. The **essay** entries will be judged by a committee of HART staff and specially selected volunteers. This committee will choose the shortlist. A guest judge will then choose one winning entry and two runner-up entries from each of the shortlists.

17. The **creative** entries will be judged by a committee of HART staff and specially selected volunteers. This committee will choose the shortlist. A guest judge will then choose one winning entry and two runner-up entries from each of the shortlists.

18. The winners and shortlist of each competition and category will be announced at the celebratory prize-giving and exhibition evening. The list will be published on the HART website and emailed to all entrants the next day.

19. All entrants will be invited to a celebratory event in London.

20. All shortlisted **creative** pieces will be exhibited at a celebratory event in London.

21. All shortlisted **essays** will be published on the HART website.

22. HART is not in a position to cover travel expenses to and from the celebratory event. Entrants must cover any cost associated with the prize. Creative pieces exhibited will be available to be taken home with their creator.

23. HART hereby excludes any liability for loss, injury or damage to persons/property or disappointment incurred by entrants as a result of entering the HART Prize for Human Rights, downloading any materials related to the Prize, or participating in the celebratory event except any other liability of HART which cannot be excluded under applicable law.
